Seniors are strongly advised to meet with visiting admissions representatives of colleges where they **may apply** or where they **know** they will definitely apply. **Juniors** are urged to meet this Fall with **at least three** college representatives, preferably at times that will not involve missing any classes or other commitments, as an introduction to the college process.

If you want to meet with a **college representative** who will visit Rowland Hall **during** a time when you have a class or other conflict, discuss the situation with the faculty member whose class or activity conflicts with the planned college representative visit at least **three school days** in advance.

Request the permission of that faculty member to miss his/her class or activity on that day and time, and offer to make up the work in advance. **Don't blow off** that class or activity and then expect that you will be excused later because you were at a college meeting. Don't expect teachers to allow you meet with college representatives if you ask them less than **three school days** out.

Meetings with **college representatives** take place in the College Counseling office, unless a different meeting place is noted above or announced the day of the visit. When more than 12 students show up to meet with one college representative, that meeting is usually moved to the Library. **Posters** of upcoming visits are just outside the college counseling office, and **we take attendance** during meetings with college representatives.

Questions about Transcript requests, Secondary School Report forms, the Common Application, scholarships, financial aid, college applications, or anything else? **Please ask!** Need or want help with your college essays, including brainstorming topics? **Please ask!**

Transcript request forms are printed on **bright orange paper** and can be found in the **red pocket folder** on Bruce Hunter's door in the College Counseling office. When completing transcript requests, students must check "yes" or "no" to whether they want their college admission **test results** printed on the back of their transcript. Some colleges require that test scores be sent to them directly from The College Board or ACT, but many will count as official the test scores printed on school transcripts.

Scholarship information that includes writing competitions, academic scholarships from individual colleges, and scholarship awards from local clubs and civic groups continues to arrive in the College Counseling office nearly every day, and can be found in the **open file boxes** on the table just inside the main entrance there. Registrations for the PROFILE financial aid form are on the top shelf of the display case which holds SAT and ACT test registration materials, campus visit forms, etc. The new FAFSA **financial aid forms** should be received in the College Counseling office by early December, and will be available at www.fafsa.gov
